

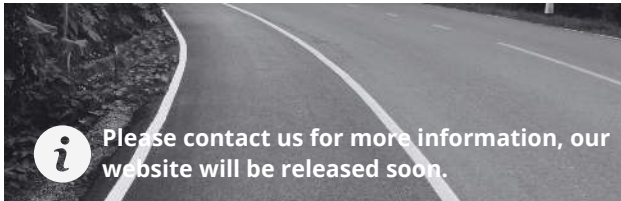
Our Mission
